





Letter from the Abbot

In June, Br August and I travel to Saint Meinrad Archabbey in southern Indiana for the general chapter of the Swiss-American congregation. Much information is packed into that sentence. I will try to provide some explanation.

After some experience with monastic life at Subiaco, Saint Benedict founded the monastery of Monte Cassino in 529. There he wrote a rule which formed the basis of monastic life in western Europe. Around 594, Pope Gregory the Great raised the profile of both the rule and its author with a work titled The Dialogues. In the early eighth century, English monks adopted Benedict's rule. About 816, a synod made Benedict's rule binding for monks in the Carolingian empire, which spanned France, Belgium, Holland Switzerland, Germany and parts of Italy and Austria. Monasteries flourished under the rule of Benedict throughout western Europe, blooming in size and wealth.

The prosperity of monasteries brought criticism, both internal and external. The Protestant reformation led to the suppression of many monasteries. In the decades after 1760, a combination of factors led to the disappearance of more than ninety percent of the monasteries in Europe. But monasticism continued to persevere, finding refuge in the Americas and other parts of the world. The monasteries filled important roles in the church, running major seminaries and schools, serving the needs of immigrants, and staffing foreign missions.

Through these centuries, Benedictine monasteries operated without any central organization. In 1893 Pope Leo XIII established a house of studies for Benedictines at Sant'Anselmo in Rome. He created a Benedictine confederation headed by an abbot primate. The confederation consists of more than 400 Benedictine monasteries grouped into congregations. The congregations are largely geographical in nature. The two largest congregations which call north America home are the American-Cassinese congregation and the Swiss-American congregation. The former owes its origins to Abbot Boniface Wimmer, a German monk from a monastery in Metten, Bavaria. Aware of the needs of German immigrants to the United States, in 1846 he established St Vincent Archabbey in Latrobe, Pennsylvania. (Avid golfers will know that Latrobe is also the home of Arnold Palmer.) The Swiss-American congregation owes its origins to two Swiss abbeys, one at Einsiedeln, and the other at Engelberg. The monastery at Einsiedeln founded St Meinrad Archabbey. The monastery at Engelberg founded Conception Abbey in northwest Missouri. Mount Michael Abbey, founded in 1954, is a daughter house of Conception Abbey.

In the Swiss-American congregation there are 18 monasteries of various sizes with a variety of apostolates. Organizations need guidelines to effectively implement their missions. The first Constitution of the Swiss-American congregation was submitted to the Congregation for the Propagation of the Faith in 1894. It was revised to conform to the new Code of Canon Law in 1917. The congregation was placed under the patronage of the Immaculate Conception. In the wake of the second Vatican council, a new constitution was written for the congregation. The constitution addresses practical problems. For example, what steps are to be taken to admit a candidate to monastic life? What actions or commitments require the approval of the monks in the monastery? How much debt can a monastery incur? The abbots, priors, and elected delegates of all the monasteries in the congregation gather periodically to be sure the answers to such questions still make sense.

One order of business for the general chapter at Saint Meinrad in June will be to elect a new abbot president for the congregation. The term of the current abbot president, Abbot Vincent Bataille, will expire at this general chapter. The agenda especially includes issues that arise from fewer vocations. For example, at the present time, the abbot of a community must be ordained. That may change at this general chapter. Issues related to finances, Medicare and Medicaid will also be topics for discussion.

Aside from the business conducted at a general chapter, it is always refreshing to celebrate our common heritage, to share time with old friends, to trade tips about handling problems common to all monasteries, and to remind ourselves of the special vocation that God has given us as monastics in this world. Hopefully, we do justice to the gift God has entrusted to us.





When Matt Plooster stepped foot on the Mount Michael campus in August 1995, he was certain of two facts. First, he had freakishly large calves. Second, he was ready to outwork anyone.
