High School Senior at 29 After Korea

A 29-year-old high school senior at St. John's Seminary near Elkhorn, Neb., is preparing for the priesthood.

He is Miguel (Mike) Guevara, veteran of the Korean conflict, and big brother to his 19 younger classmates.

Mike entered St. John's three years ago to close the gap between a sixth grade education and a high school diploma.

An Ottawa, Kans., priest urged Mike to enter the seminary. Mike was there on a television antenna installation job.

Every summer he hitchhiked to Tulare, Cal., to his once-fulltime job for a manufacturer of antennas. His earnings paid tuition.

His experience as an Army sergeant—Silver Star winner—and foreman helps him in directing seminary work projects. He also leads daily physical workouts for students not active in intramural sports.

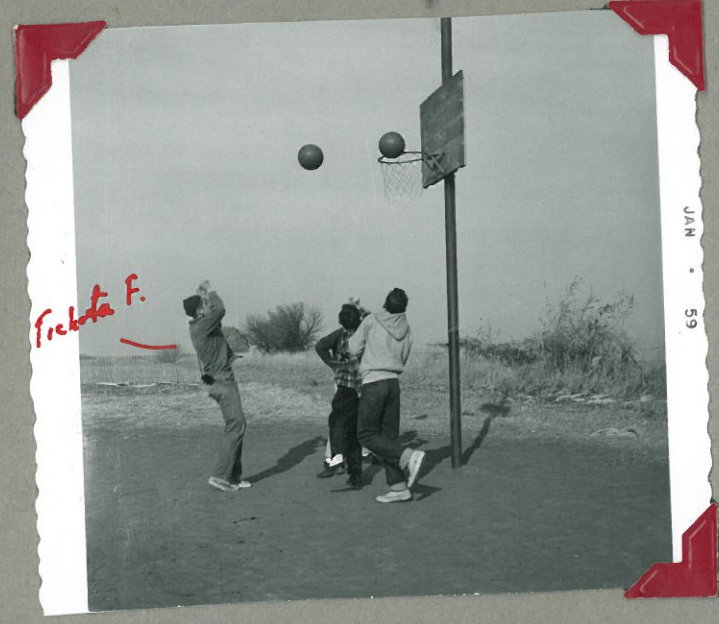
Brother Victor Coleman, O.S.B., said Mike is a general handyman and a good student. "The boys look up to him. He's a natural leader."

After graduation, Mike will continue his studies at a college-level seminary, probably Conception (Mo.) Seminary, Brother Victor said.



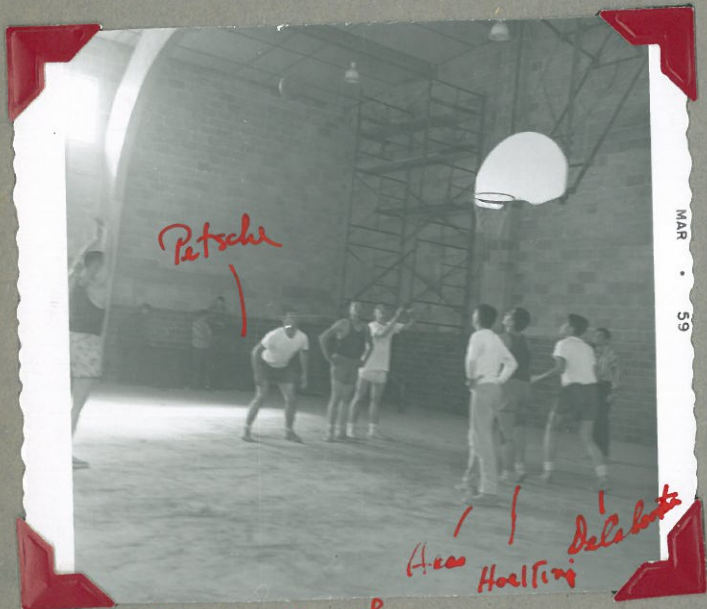

Albion takes A honors in meet here

Thrilling competition for both class titles featured the St. Bonaventure Invitational staged Friday at Pawnee Park.

Albion captured Class A laurels with 46 points, nosing out Pierce by a slim three-point margin. The battle was even closer in Class B, where Norfolk Sacred Heart nipped David City St. Mary, 54-52.

The "B" fight went right down to the final event, the mile relay, which Sacred Heart won for six points, while St. Mary's third place was worth three points. Going into that event, the David City squad had held a one-point edge.

In "A", Pierce still had an outside chance for the title going into the mile relay, but managed only a third place while Albion was getting fourth.

Humphrey High, sparked by Larry Janssen in the sprints, finished a strong third in Class B with 36 1/2 points. Holy Name was a tough third in Class A with 35 1/2 points, and Newman Grove was close behind with 31.

Three new Invitational records were set. McHenry of Albion sailed the discuss 139-10; Aubert of Pierce broad jumped 20-1; and Janssen of Humphrey set a 220 mark of :23.6.

It was the first year that the meet was run in two classes, so all winning performances in Class B stand as class records.

McHenry was the sparkplug for Albion, winning the discuss, tying for first in the pole vault, and picking up other points in low hurdles, shot put and high jump. Aubert led the Pierce bid with a first in the broad jump, and other placings in 440, pole vault and high jump.

Widhalm and Svoboda paced Sacred Heart in Class B, while the Kirby brothers and Art Mastera led St. Mary's. Janssen of Humphrey slammed the sprints, and Bright of Duncan copped both hurdles.

Kosiba Sets Mark

St. Bonaventure, the host team, tallied 9 1/2 points in Class A. Leo Kosiba finished second in the discuss with 134 feet, a new school record, and other points were registered by the third-place 880 relay team (Bob Golonka, Kosiba, Larry Minette, Al Kusek); Golonka, who tied for fourth in the broad jump; and Joe Liss, fifth in the discuss.

It was the first competition of the season for most of the schools, and performances were generally good in view of that fact and the "fair" track conditions.

The meet was sponsored by Columbus Council No. 938, Knights of Columbus. Merle Stewart of Omaha served as head starter.

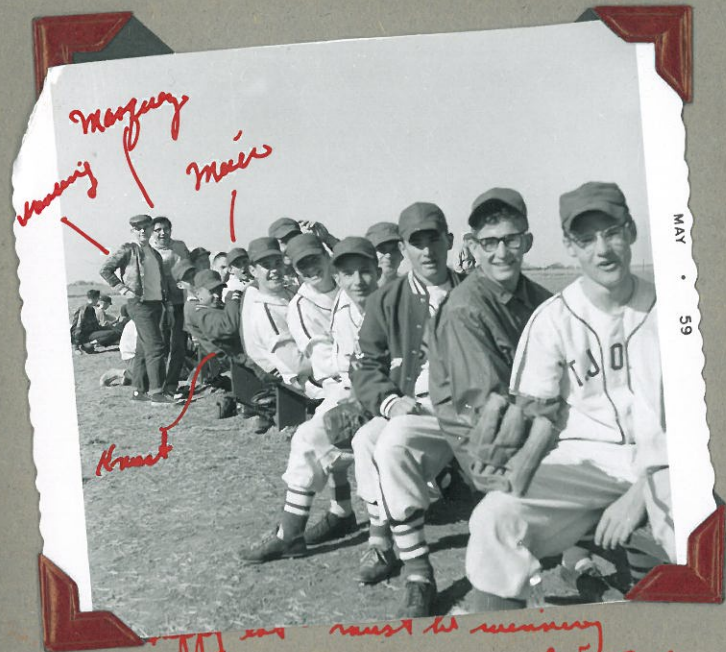

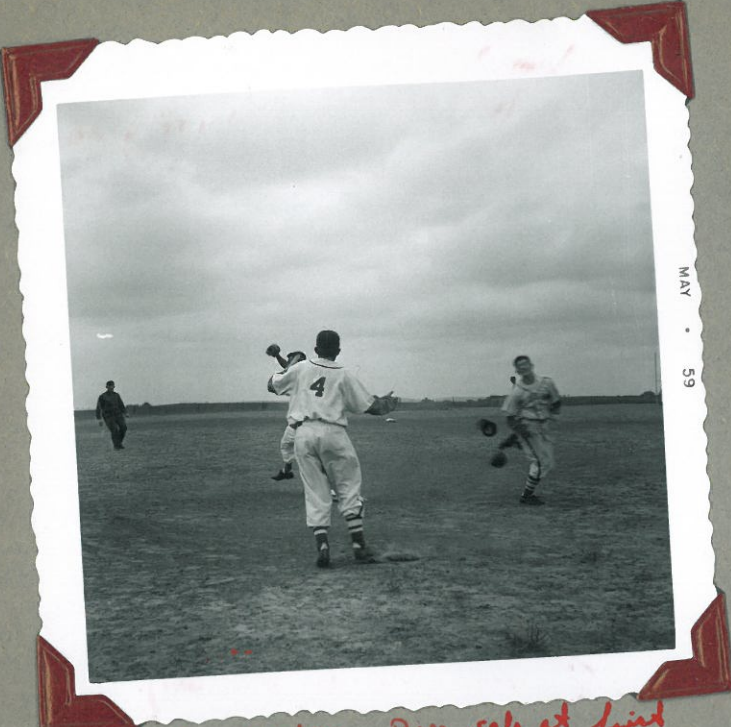

The First Four Years

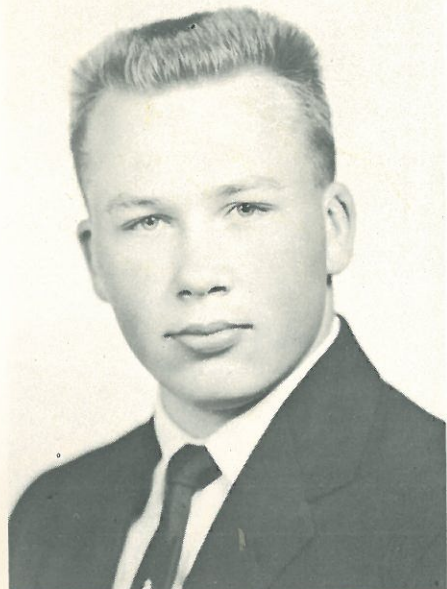
Four years ago this coming September a group of freshmen from all over the Midwest started on what looked like an awfully long education. We were the last high school freshman class to enter Conception Seminary, and we came in assorted sizes, from cities and farms, from Catholic and public schools; about the only thing we had in common was the status of freshmen, but there is nothing so unifying as being members of the lowest group, and so unite we did. The highlights of our first year? Just about everything: the solemn liturgical functions, homesickness, upperclassmen who no longer seemed so terrible, long study halls, the big monastery full of hooded men, bells from 6 A.M. to 9 P.M. And of course, there were the rumors, reports, stories, and constant talk of "Saint John's at Elkhorn." It was an eventful year, pleasant to look back on, but live over?

The next fall Saint John's Seminary was a reality: a new home, many new faces (classmates and monks), a windy hill in Nebraska, a space where a gymnasium would be some day, and not least, we were no longer low men on the totem pole. The sophomore year was one of combining new and old, setting customs, more study, and enjoyment of our new home.

In the fall of 1957 we found that our original group had lost some of its numbers, but many new faces had been added. There was no gym yet, but soccer wasn't such a bad sport after all. The school began to look "lived in," sometimes too much so, but there was grass now, and the trees were growing a little each year. We were the top men in study hall, gave the Christmas program, moved into the refectory with the cassocked seniors, and had a few juniors in the schola cantorum.

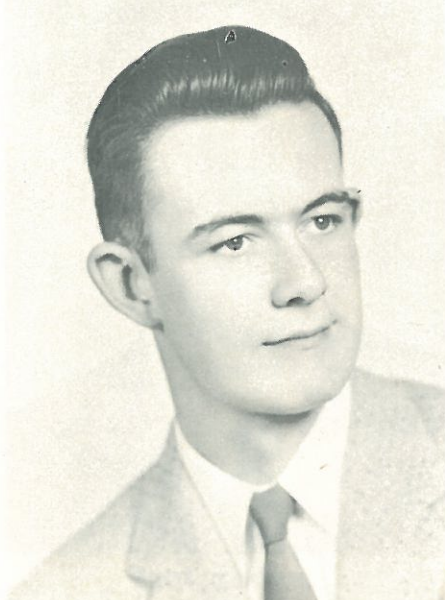
The biggest change of all comes from the junior to the senior year. The cassocks and collars, the semi-private rooms, serving as master of ceremonies at high Mass, giving the Mardi Gras and raising \$2,300 towards paying for the finally realized gymnasium, supervising the work crews, an occasional trip to Omaha for a play, Virgil in Latin, Shakespeare in English, Father Benedict, our prefect in the hall at the wrong times, and finally preparations for graduation; all these and more make the senior year the best.

This is only the "first plateau," on the way to the priesthood. Next year we will be scattered; some back to Saint John's, some to Conception, and some elsewhere. Some will stay for another eight years; some won't; but the first four years have been, for all their rough spots, quick and pleasant ones.
