



## Letter from the Abbot



Br James Pope, a monk of Mount Michael who died in 2020, had a wry observation about the school year. He would say, "It is like a roller coaster. It has lots of up and downs, thrills, and chills... Only you cannot get off for nine months." Sometimes life feels like that also. There are moments of exhilaration. There are moments difficult to endure. Because the death of Br James came at the height of the Covid pandemic, his only surviving brother Michael was not able to come to his funeral. He finally was able to pay respects at his brother's graveside in late May. It was a pleasure to have him join us for a few days, even though the occasion was marked with a tinge of sadness.

On a personal note, my brother Gus died in May of this year. Because Gus was just a bit over a year younger than I am, I do not remember a day without him in my life. We did everything together. We played checkers, chess, cribbage, Monopoly, and a dozen other board games. We played baseball. We went hunting and fishing. We were altar servers at St Joseph Parish. We rode bicycles all over town. We played tennis together. You would be amazed how high into the air Gus could make a T2000 tennis racket bounce when he was disgusted with a shot. I was older, but he was usually better at everything. I could not begin to touch him on the golf course. He could play the piano and the guitar. I could play the radio. He was charming, witty, and personable. If you look at his graduation picture, he looks like a movie star. I look like a geek. Like me, Gus considered the priesthood. But he eventually married and had two wonderful children, Crystal, and Mike. His death was a low point on the coaster ride for me. The many wonderful memories remind me though that there were far more high points.

It is surely the case that religious life seems a coaster ride of late. In 1965, my freshman year at St John Seminary (the precursor to Mount Michael Benedictine), there were 58,632 Catholic priests in the United States. In 2024, that number stands at 34,344. According to the Ordo of the Swiss American congregation, in 1965 there 1004 monks in the Benedictine monasteries of the congregation. (There are other congregations of Benedictine monks.) In 2024, the number stands at 417. No Catholic needs to be quoted statistics to know that sixty years on from 1965, Catholicism inhabits a different world.


Through the centuries Christianity has been swept along by tides of change. For those who enjoyed the flourishing of the Catholic Church in the post-World War II era, the present experience might seem disheartening. It is easy to be swept along by the ebb and flow of cultural, social, and religious trends. But I suspect it is important to remember that the present moment is just a different point on the coaster ride. In a way, with fewer numbers we are afforded more opportunities to reflect the love of Christ in the world.

Every year at the close of the school year, the monastic community has a retreat. This year we had the good fortune to have Fr Konrad Schaefer as retreat master. Fr Konrad has spent many years serving at monasteries in Mexico and central America. Fr Konrad spoke about the psalms, woven into the fabric of our monastic prayer life. He began with the first line of Psalm 127, "Unless the Lord builds the house, its builders labor in vain." The line resonates with Chapter 7 from the gospel of Matthew:

<sup>24</sup> 'Everyone then who hears these words of mine and acts on them will be like a wise man who built his house on rock. <sup>25</sup> The rain fell, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on rock. <sup>26</sup> And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not act on them will be like a foolish man who built his house on sand. <sup>27</sup> The rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell—and great was its fall!

By the end of this summer, I will have traveled through Greece and the islands of the Aegean, tracing many places the Apostle Paul brought the good news of the death and resurrection of Jesus. For those on the pilgrimage, I suspect it will be a high point on their personal coaster ride. St Paul writes to the Corinthians – Corinth is one of our stopping points – "Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain." We hope that our efforts as a religious community are built on a solid foundation. We give ourselves to the work of the Lord. We trust that our efforts are not in vain. We hold to the rock of Christ in every storm, knowing that with firm footing, we cannot be swept away by the tides of change.

Perhaps no matter where each one of us happens to be on our personal roller coaster ride, it is well to recall Psalm 90. The psalm was fashioned into a lovely song by Janet Sullivan Whitaker with these lyrics which offer the psalmist's enduring reassurance. "In every age, O God, you have been our refuge. In every age, O God, you have been our hope."

He was also honored as Omaha West Rotary Club's Outstanding Student Citizen!


#### ACADEMIC DECATHLON

## **MISSION & MINISTRY**

At Mount Michael Benedictine School, our five Benedictine values are the hallmarks of our tradition. Service, community, hospitality, moderation, and integrity line the arches as you walk into the D.J. Sokol building, they are prominent on the banners in the school hallways, they are the themes for which we begin our weekly chapel on Monday mornings. More than being five words which guide the life at Mount Michael they are meant to be the guiding values for our everyday lives. St. Benedict selected these values to be part of his Rule hundreds of years ago and today they remain a part of life not only for us here at Mount Michael, but for Benedictines around the world.



Since I began my role as Director of Mission and Ministry at Mount Michael in January, I have learned a lot about the Benedictine tradition and experienced countless tangible ways that the community of Mount Michael lives out our Benedictine values. From the way that students' welcome guests and prospective families to finding balance in schoolwork and extracurricular activities, it is clear that Benedictine values are engrained in everything that we do. As a new member of Mount Michael, community has been one of the values that stands out the most in the daily life of our school and abbey.

For St. Benedict, community is the place where the practice of charity is lived out on a daily basis, where God is encountered in the other, and where we find the way to salvation and eternal life. Through community, St. Benedict

tells us that we are drawn closer together as a family through service to one another and that we are drawn closer to God and heaven. This is a powerful statement, and it is one that Mount Michael does not take lightly.

At the end of April, the Elkhorn and Bennington communities were devastated by a tornado that just missed our school. As the students, faculty, staff, and parents of the Mount Michael community took shelter, our neighbors lost their homes, their personal possessions, and many of their sentimental treasures. As a community, Mount Michael was quick to respond to devastation and sought out opportunities to serve our neighbors.

Together, our entire student body, our faculty and staff, monks, parents, alumni, and board members came together to help with the tornado relief efforts. Our group

of approximately 250 people were sent out to a neighboring farm to help collect debris left in the fields from the tornado. The farmers we worked with quickly acknowledged how helpful our hands were when they alone wouldn't have been able to clear all that was left behind in the wake of the devastation. What was powerful to me, as a new member of this community, is that Mount Michael wasn't doing this for recognition or affirmation. They were out there picking up debris for six hours because it was an opportunity to live out their Benedictine value of community. They saw that their community was in need, and they responded. Like St. Benedict stated, as a community we were able to practice charity, to encounter God in our neighbors, and to be drawn closer to heaven through our work. Our school didn't just make an impact on the clearing of debris, but they made an impact on the community.

For me, as someone new to Omaha, having grown up and spent most of my life on the East Coast, community was one of the main things I was looking for when it came to a place of work in a new city away from my family and friends. My husband Frank and I embarked on this journey not knowing who or what we would find. Somehow, God called me to the Mount Michael community. Before our move, I heard about the connectedness, care, and hospitality of people in Omaha. I wasn't prepared for what I had heard to not only be true, but to have found that the sense of community and belonging at Mount Michael is unmatched and unlike anywhere else. I am grateful for this community and to now be able to call it my own.

Community requires participation from all. It cannot depend only on one group of people, but rather takes everyone for true community to be lived out. This is what I have found at Mount Michael. Community is lived out by our students, faculty, staff, families, alumni, board members, and the greater Omaha community connected to Mount Michael. St. Benedict knew that community was a crucial part of the life of his monks and I am grateful that this value has carried on hundreds of years so that it too can be a critical part of the daily life at Mount Michael Benedictine School.

## ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

**JACOB IDRA '18**

During my time at Mount Michael, I have been fortunate enough to share stories on some unbelievable and well-respected alumni and figures from The Mount – David (D.J) Sokol '99, Fr. Daniel Hendrickson '89, and Coach Jim "Killer" Kane to name a few. Today I get to share the story of one, in my opinion, the hardest working and most successful alumni of recent years, Jacob Idra '18.

Jacob comes from South Sudan and his family escaped the Second South Sudanese Civil War in the early 2000s and made the jump to the United States in 2004. Ultimately, Idra and his family landed in Omaha, Nebraska and Idra would enroll at All Saints in 2005. Moving to America, his parents had a vision that stretched beyond their current reality – for him and his six siblings to live out their dreams with no limits.

When it came time to choosing a high school, Idra chose to go to Mount Michael. A considerable influence in his decision to attend Mount Michael was the Dorsey Family (Ray '16 and Jordan '04), Mohammad Elradi '15, and Eric Crawford '00, Admissions Director at that time. "The Dorsey's and Mo we're like brothers to me, and they were really the ones to introduce me to Mount Michael." On Crawford, Idra said that he admired the way that Crawford challenged him to see how Mount Michael Students pushed themselves to high expectation. "Greatness was expected, and that was what drew me to Mount Michael." Idra would find a home in The Mount.

During his time at Mount Michael, Idra took part in basketball, tennis, golf, choir, Men Of Benedict and was a Eucharistic Minister.

Idra's biggest influence while at Mount Michael was his history teacher and basketball coach, John Roshone '99. The thing that Idra admired about Roshone was that he always drove Idra to be the best he could be, first in the classroom and secondly on the court. "He helped me realize that life was like basketball. I began taking the disciplines I learned on the court and began applying

them to my life." Roshone's history class, along with so many alumni, was Idra's favorite class while attending The Mount. "It was not a typical history class. Roshone had a way of putting history in story form. His approach to teaching made every day of class engaging and interesting, and I really appreciated that as a student."

A favorite story that comes to mind for Idra was his freshman year while taking Fr. Richard Thell's speech class. "There was one rule for Father's class, and that rule was do not touch Father's motorized chair!" Idra, feeling confident about the way the basketball year was going to go, made a bet with Fr Richard – Mount Michael makes it to state, I get to take his chair for a free ride. Later in the 2014-2015 year, The Knights would end up securing a bid to the NSAA 2014-2015 State Playoffs, and Fr. Richard was true to his word. "I remember seeing Fr. Richard on his motorized chair after we made it to state and the only thing I said to him was, 'scoot on over!"

Following his successful career at The Mount, Idra would go on to major in finance and minor in African American History at Creighton University. While studying at Creighton, Idra would return to Dean at Mount Michael for the 2021 and 2022 school years. I was fortunate enough to be able to dean next to Idra for the 2021 school year and can speak firsthand to the impact and work ethic that Idra instilled in the classes that he had the pleasure to dean over.

In 2019, Idra, along with a group of friends, had a vision to give underserved youth in the South Sudanese community a place to go where they could embrace their culture and receive mentorship and guidance. Idra currently serves as ROSS Leaders Founder and Executive Director. In their founding year, they began with just 20 students and have since served more than 500 co-ed students in six different cities across the United States.

What began as an idea to offer South Sudanese youth the opportunity for mentorship and guidance, has now grown to

the largest South Sudanese youth serving organization in the United States. Led by powerful programs under their four pillars: Academic Support, Health and Wellness, Career Exploration, and Cultural Engagement, ROSS Leaders aim to inspire inner city students to think big and achieve their goals. Idra quotes, "Youth in inner city America, especially minorities, see more than your typical college student or even adult by the time they reach their teenagers. That is just the reality of the America we live in. Since we have experienced many of those challenges ourselves, we view it as our responsibility to pave a better road for the next generation to go further than we have."

heritage. ROSS' immediate goal is to continue to be creative and innovative to ensure that every student within the organization has the resources and programs they need to reach their version of success. The goal is to learn what challenges the new students are facing and serve them best. "The challenges that my generation faced are not going to be the same challenges that our community will face in 30 years. I want to make sure that our leaders in ROSS remain thoughtful, creative, and openminded so we can continue to pave the way for those generations to be better off and more set up for success than we currently are."





What began as an idea to offer South Sudanese youth the opportunity for mentorship and guidance, has now grown to the largest South Sudanese youth serving organization in the United States.

Notably, ROSS Leaders basketball program, known as SO Elite Basketball Training, creates pathways for student athletes to compete in regional and national camps as well as given South Sudanese student athletes the opportunity to connect with their roots and return home to South Sudan to connect with the youth there. "Over 70% of our population in South Sudan is under the age of 30, and we have a booming South Sudanese-American population in the US. So, ROSS serves as the platform where people in our diaspora community can stay connected with our people in South Sudan. We serve as the bridge between the opportunities here in the US and the possibilities that exist back home."

Speaking on the role that basketball plays in the South Sudanese community, Idra adds, "The game of basketball has played such a significant role in the lives of people in our community. Flip on any college basketball game, and you will see a South Sudanese player more times than not. In our organization alone, we have had over 50 students go play college athletics. That means a free education and an opportunity to choose a career that is going to feed your family and change the trajectory of your life's future forever. When you come from nothing, that is a big deal."

The heart of ROSS is their community, and the vision of ROSS is to create a platform for leaders to connect and build communities.

For the future, Idra envisions ROSS Leaders to serve as a community centered organization model that other African Immigrant communities can adapt to build their community in the United States while being connected to their respective

When asked what advice he would share for current students, Idra did not struggle to share his knowledge. "Understand that you are going to be a leader in some way shape or form – so start to practice it now. It can be in the form of leading a team in a group project, on a sports team, or even leading in your own family. As a leader, stick to your philosophies, be confident in them, be willing to learn, but do not back down. Use the Benedictine values as a base and continue to build from there."

I know I speak for so many when I say that I am constantly impressed and admire the work that Jacob has done and continues to do. Over the past 10 years, I have gotten to know Jacob and I can honestly say that I am blessed to call him a friend.

The thing I appreciate about Jacob is how easy it is to just talk with him. Me and Jacob can go two-three months without talking and when we do talk, it is like nothing has changed. His desire to get to know you on a personal level is something that cannot be taught. It just speaks to Idra's character. Ray Dorsey '16, sums it up best, "Jacob is one of a kind. For me, no matter how long it has been, when we connect whether in person or by phone, it is like no time has gone by. He has a knack for connecting with people and he always takes the time to really check in and ask deeper level questions on how I am."

I am honored to get to call Jacob a friend and I know that I can speak for everyone that has had the pleasure to get to know Jacob that he has become a shining spot for the entire Omaha community, and we cannot wait to see what he accomplishes next!
